- Helped UTD receive matching funds from the state to support efforts to become a Tier 1 public research university

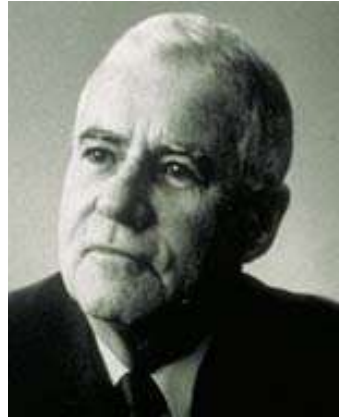
